

Oklahoma City Bombing Survivor Richard Williams Heads-up Fall Training - September 30th

Richard Williams, former director of the General Services Administration (GSA) in Oklahoma City, was the featured speaker. Richard survived the bombing of the Murrah Federal Building from his first floor office. He became a driving force behind the vision and completion of the memorial and museum honoring those who experienced the April 19, 1995 tragedy.

Richard has worked with the victims, survivors and families of September 11, 2001. He not only has helped with the emotional healing, but also in being a mentor in creating a memorial.

Due to the recent terrorism alerts, the AR-CRT responders that were deployed during 9-11 went through

a series of NOVA retrospectives. All felt it was timely and important for self-care.

Dr. Jennifer Lang briefed the team on how to conduct a retrospective group crisis intervention. She emphasized how effective this tool is after time has passed.
